<p><b>Cans and Bottles Bins</b></p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- All plastic bottles</li> <li>- All plastic containers</li> <li>- Aluminum cans</li> <li>- Steel cans</li> <li>- Unbroken glass containers</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Grocery bags – recycle these at a local grocery store</li> <li>- Plastic wrap</li> <li>- Aluminum foil</li> <li>- Foods and liquids</li> </ul>
<p><b>Comingled Paper Bins</b></p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Newspapers</li> <li>- Magazines</li> <li>- Junk mail</li> <li>- Printer paper</li> <li>- Notebook paper</li> <li>- Cardboard boxes</li> <li>- Cereal and shoe boxes</li> <li>- Soft cover books</li> <li>- Phone books</li> <li>- Egg cartons (with no egg residue)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Paper towels and napkins</li> <li>- Tissues</li> <li>- Beverage cups with a waxy coating</li> <li>- Styrofoam containers or cups</li> <li>- Foods and liquids</li> </ul>
<p><b>E-waste Bins</b> (ZSR Library and Benson)</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Printer Cartridges</li> <li>- Cell phones, chargers and accessories</li> <li>- MP3 players, iPods, Digital cameras</li> <li>- Rechargeable batteries and their chargers</li> <li>- Hand-held games</li> <li>- Computer/Printer cords and accessories</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Regular, non-rechargeable alkaline batteries</li> <li>- Computers and Printers – send personal computers back to the manufacturer or take them to an electronics recycler like Goodwill; all WFU computers need to be returned to Information Services</li> <li>- CDs, DVDs, CD-Rs, and diskettes</li> </ul>
